

By the Numbers Bowl Edition

Welcome to the bowl edition of By the Numbers. Here you will find some commentary on each of the (41!) bowl games as well as the computer's picks. If the games were played immediately, I'd be pretty confident in the picks. But after coaches leave, top players opt out of bowls to protect their health, and teams have a month or more to practice, get healthy, get complacent, and so on, it's not surprising that the computer's accuracy drops considerably.

The committee got off easy this year. No controversy at the top, only a tough choice among Oklahoma, Georgia, and Ohio State for #4 (and first shot at Alabama). This would have been a nice simple year for the BCS or any two-team choice situation. Both semifinals have double-digit point spreads, which is unusual (but my computer agrees).

The first game I saw at Clemson was against Notre Dame. Their coach Dan (not) Devine had been griping publicly about the Clemson crowd noise, and as I walked into the stadium several people told me, "We're giving Notre Dame the silent treatment. Pass it on." I had no idea what they were talking about, until the pregame festivities started and there was no crowd noise and the band marched with instruments up but not playing. The national anthem was normal, but that's followed by the Clemson fight song which has a chant and arm motions: no sound from the band, crowd arm motions in sync but no chanting. Then at kickoff, the biggest roar you've ever heard. This is when I became a huge Clemson fan.

The game was good, too. There was a strong wind blowing downfield, and all points were scored downwind. Notre Dame 7-0 after 1, then Clemson 10-7 at half, then Clemson 17-7 at the end of three. Two good Clemson drives on the ground ended with fumbles, and the ND quarterback starting his first game led a fourth quarter comeback to win 21-17. You might have heard of him: Joe Montana. The background image (from my faithful "Brownie" camera) shows Devine being escorted off *from midfield* where he handed the ref back his flag. This was followed by the ref tossing the flag back up in the air for unsportsmanlike conduct. I've never seen a coach do that (not even Woody Hayes, who was on the Ohio State sideline when he slugged Charlie Bauman). The Clemson fans among you (anybody?) will notice the lack of an upper deck and if you could see the unfaded picture you'd catch the old pajamas-Tiger outfit. A simpler time.

There were some good stories this year. Purdue Superfan Tyler Trent was on Game Day, there were some great plays (look up the North Texas punt return against Arkansas if you haven't seen it) with an outrageous number of one-handed catches, Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts got redemption against Georgia after not transferring (meanwhile, transfer quarterback Kyler Murray won the Heisman). Eastern Michigan grabbed some bowling pins and a camera and danced their way into a bowl game.

For each game, starting with the six (!) on December 15, I list the computer's pick (no home field) TV information, and some unscientific fake news.

The final regular season ratings follow the picks.

12/31 Gator Bowl Texas A&M 35, NC State 31

7:30 ESPN Jacksonville
