

## By the Numbers Bowl Edition

Welcome to the bowl edition of By the Numbers. Here you will find some commentary on each of the (41!) bowl games as well as the computer's picks. If the games were played immediately, I'd be pretty confident in the picks. But after coaches leave, top players opt out of bowls to protect their health, and teams have a month or more to practice, get healthy, get complacent, and so on, it's not surprising that the computer's accuracy drops considerably.

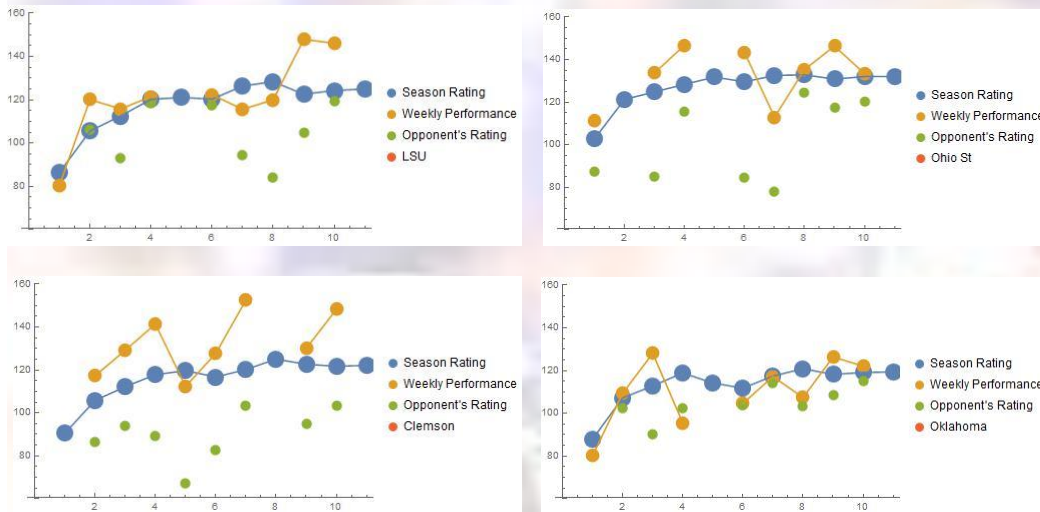
The committee got off easy this year. Little controversy at the top (depending on how much you care about the order of 1-2-3), and not an especially tough choice for #4. LSU and Oklahoma have only played twice, in the 1950 and 2004 Sugar Bowls. Ohio State and Clemson have only played three times, all in bowl games won by Clemson. The 2004 LSU-Oklahoma game has some interesting parallels with this year's. It featured the Heisman winner (OU's Jason White then, LSU's Joe Burrow now) leading an unstoppable offense on one side, and a great defense on the other side (oops, just lost the parallels). These were two of three teams that were clearly the top three. Unfortunately, in 2004 only two made the playoffs so USC had to play elsewhere. Two trivia questions from this game. Easy: name LSU's coach, who won his first of many national championships. Harder: name the LSU defensive lineman shown smashing Jason White in the background, whose pick-6 was vital to LSU's 21-14 win. He's now an ESPN commentator who recently went viral for laughing his way off the "Get Up" set when another analyst said that Trevor Lawrence is playing better than any other QB.

I have to add a little more Clemson color to this edition (surprise!). A catch made in the Virginia game by Tee Higgins is one of the best I've ever seen. The picture below doesn't completely do it justice – check out the video online. The picture shows his first touch of the ball.

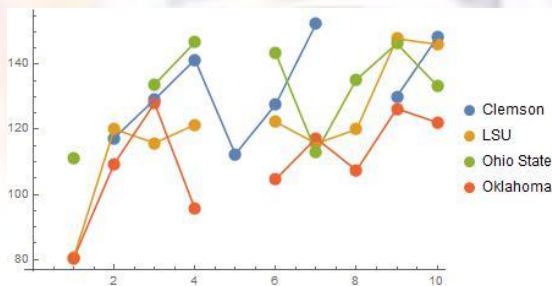


Let's transfer over to the Heisman and quarterbacks. Three of the four Heisman finalists, and three of the four semifinal starters, are transfers. Ohio State traded Joe Burrow for Justin Fields. Georgia donated Fields, as well as Jacob Eason to Washington. Jalen Hurts, of course, came to Oklahoma from Alabama. Clemson doesn't have a transfer, but they did export QBs to Missouri and Northwestern. This is college football's version of the one-and-done. As a fan, I don't like it but with all of the money in college football it's at best naïve to expect to see amateurs on the field. And, it is certainly better than the old days of players having no options other than letting their coaches bully them into giving up their scholarships.

I have week-by-week data saved on each of the teams this year. Below are plots for the four playoff teams. These are week-by-week starting with the 4<sup>th</sup> week. Team rating is in blue, opponent's rating in green, and "performance" (opponent's rating plus win margin) in orange.



And this shows the weekly performances of the four. For what it's worth, it looks to me that Ohio State (a clear #1 in my ratings), Clemson, and LSU are just about even.



The PlayStation Player Impact Rating is a "plus-minus" system comparing a team's performance when the player is in the game to its performance when the player is out. It's an interesting list:

K.J. Hill is Ohio State's top-rated player at #17 (Justin Fields at #24), Grant Delpit's LSU top player at #27, and Oklahoma doesn't have anybody in the top 50. Plus-minus systems generally do not work well with players who are almost never out.

**NC A&T (8-3):** Jah-Maine Martin ran for 1136 yards, DE Devin Harren leads the Aggies.

**Alcorn (9-3):** Felix Harper threw for 2613 yards and 30 TDs for the Braves.

2:00 ESPN Albuquerque

Rugged defense against a good passing attack. Nice year for CM after going 1-11 last year.

**SDS (9-3):** By my ratings, would score less than 2 points per game against own defense. New QB Carson Baker may improve that, but the real story is great LB Kyahva Tezino.

**CM (8-5):** The Chips have a transfer QB, the star is WR Kalil Pimpleton, who can pop a big one.

A high-scoring affair for two teams that had strong finishes to good seasons.

**Haw (9-5):** Cole McDonald threw for 3642 yards and 29 TDs for the Rainbows.

**BYU (7-5):** Won 5 of last 6. Several QBs played, team averaged 285 yards/game.

8:45 ESPN New Orleans
